

SQE exemptions: questions and answers

Exemption from the SQE assessments is only available to qualified lawyers. To help explain all your options we have put together these questions and answers.

General questions about SQE exemptions

If my application is refused can I make another application for exemption?

Yes, but you would need to provide new evidence and information than in your previous application.

Can I sit SQE1 while awaiting an SQE2 exemption decision?

Yes, if you are ready to sit SQE1 you can do this alongside making your exemption application. Any results from this exam will not affect the decision.

And if the exemption is not granted you will need to have passed SQE1 before you are allowed to sit SQE2.

Is there a time limit on when I have to sit any additional assessments if I have an exemption?
