Warning: Emails misusing the name of Linklaters LLP

2 January 2025

Emails have been sent from the email domain 'linklaters.com@proton.me' in relation to the re-issuing of invoices.

What is the scam?

Emails have been sent from an individual claiming to be a staff member at 'Linklaters' in relation to the re-issuing of invoices and payment to an alternative bank account.

The emails were sent using the email domain 'linklaters.com@proton.me'.

The email misuse the name of a genuine firm of solicitors (see below).

Any business or transactions through the email domain 'linklaters.com@proton.me' are not undertaken by a firm or individual authorised and regulated by the SRA.

Is there a genuine firm or person?

The SRA authorises and regulates a genuine firm of solicitors called Linklaters LLP. The genuine firm's head office is at One Silk Street, London, EC2 8HQ. The firm's genuine email domains end with @linklaters.com.

Linklaters LLP has confirmed it does not have any connection to the emails referred to in the above alert.

What should I do?

When a firm's or individual's identity has been copied exactly (or cloned), due diligence is necessary. If you receive correspondence claiming to be from the above firm(s) or individual(s), or information of a similar nature to that described, you should conduct your own due diligence by checking the authenticity of the correspondence by contacting the law firm directly by reliable and established means. You can contact the SRA to find out if individuals or firms are regulated and authorised by the SRA and verify an individual's or firm's practising details. Other verification methods, such as checking public records (e.g. telephone directories and company records) may be required in other circumstances.
