Decision details

4. Any proposed variation to the job description, duties, or arrangements as to Rakesh Sood's supervision are notified to the SRA in advance of the changes taking place and that the variation must not take place until permission is granted by the SRA.
5. Rakesh Sood shall not have any responsibility for or be involved in the training or supervision of any other employee at Allied Law

6. This approval will lapse if Mr Sood's employment with Allied Law Chambers Solicitors Limited is terminated.
7. This approval and the conditions attached to it are subject to review at the absolute discretion of the SRA
